

# **Our Favorite Time Of Year**

Every year in May the Caring Women's Connection allocates the money raised during the year to charities requesting grants. And each year we are inspired when we review the wonderful work these organizations do to support women and children in our area. Our grant recipients this year were:

**A Safe Place** – We support this organization that provides emergency shelter and continued support to victims of domestic violence.

**The Lake County Haven** – We support their program that provides shelter to homeless women and children along with life skills and job training.

**Omni Youth Services** – We support a girls' afterschool program that teaches at-risk high school age girls life skills and provides counseling.

**Emmaus House of Hospitality** – We are pleased to fund a program to give children free shoes and boots. Our funds will also go to supplying cleaning supplies and personal hygiene products to the food pantry clients.

**CASA Lake County** – Our support will allow for training to three additional volunteers who advocate for children in foster care or suffering abuse through intricacies of the court system and beyond.

**Joanie's Closet** – Our funding provides school supplies and necessities to children in need in the District 95 school system.

**Operation Warm** – We fund the purchase of winter coats which are provided to children in need during a Fall event at The Chapel Lake Zurich.

# **Another Amazing Year**

hank you for another amazing year! I am grateful to every person reading this letter. We had a wonderful year meeting new friends and neighbors, new businesses, and working together to make a difference for those in need.

We expanded our volunteer opportunities this year, held more "socials," and continued on with our monthly events and specialty fundraisers. Our membership is growing — for a small fee of \$50 (or more if you choose) you become a member of an organization that makes a difference, and has fun doing it! Our Corporate Members grew to over 50 — please remember to support these organizations that support our cause (see website for current list).

Because of everyone's work, we were able to award \$8,400 in scholarships to deserving Lake County students on their way to college. We were also able to award \$70,000 in grant allocations! Collectively, we raised over \$20,000 more than last year which REALLY MAKES A DIFFERENCE. Notably, our largest single donation was \$5000, and we had a donation from Continental Motors of \$3500; the rest was achieved through fundraisers we held, ones our Corporate Members held for us and community organizing.

I had the honor of calling the grant recipients and letting them know we were able to fully fund their request (and in a few cases, give them more than they asked for!). To hear the joy and excitement in their voices was an heart-felt experience I will never forget.

- YOU are the reason the shelter is able to offer room, board, counseling and more to those in need,
- YOU are the reason teens in crisis will have much needed resources,
- YOU are the reason Ela township children will have shoes and boots for school this year and other deserving causes have been met by our organization.

Thank you for trusting us to get your hard-earned money to those in need with proven track records of success. Thank you for being a part of our organization — from those who attend many events to those who can attend only a few you made a difference!

We are meeting at the end of June to plan for our next year beginning in September, and look forward to bringing you programs and events to continue our mission. **Helping Women Period** – Chicago\* – Our grant will allow this organization to provide feminine hygiene products, which are expensive and not covered by government assistance, to low income women in our area.

**Center for Enriched Living** – We provide funds towards scholarships to this program of activities, learning and support for children with special needs.

**The Chapel Food Pantry** – We fund three food trucks that bring frozen and fresh food to those in need during events at The Chapel Lake Zurich.

**Samaritan House (Catholic Charities)** – Our support goes to their emergency fund allowing them to help area residents with immediate financial support not otherwise covered by their programs.

**Rest In His Arms\*** – We are helping to fund training for volunteers who convert donated wedding gowns into burial garments for babies that never make it home from the hospital. This service aids families that already are dealing with the death of an infant.

**SNAP** – Our support allows lower income special needs children in District 95 participate in this afterschool activity and exercise program.

**CWC School Supplies Program** – We were able to fund our perennial program to provide school supplies and backpacks to the children of our supported shelters.



Working with individuals with special needs has become the main focus of my life in the past years and has truly become one of my passions. The friends I have met through Best Buddies have truly inspired me to help in my community, and have changed my life in countless ways. Next year, I look forward to getting involved in Best Buddies and similar organizations in Nashville and furthering my academics.



# Hope Hudgins \$2000 Award Recipient

In the fall, I will be attending Auburn University where I plan to study Global Studies in Human Sciences. I am planning for my area of focus to be on philanthropy and non-profit organization. Over the last four years, I have attended my church's mission trips to various areas around the United States.
