Day of Sale Instructions:

- Post your house number on your mailbox and decorate.
- Garage sale hours are officially 9am-3pm, however veteran garage shoppers are
 often out prior to 9am. You may stay open past 3pm if you so desire. Removing
 your house number and closing your garage door will indicate that you are done
 with selling.
- Please remove any debris at the end of the day.
- Check with the Boy Scout Troop 198 for pickup of any items you wish to donate. Information is listed above and on our website.

Safety Information

- Do not invite strangers into your home! Public restrooms/ port-o-potties will be provided at the Village Barn. Keep your doors to your home locked while you are selling, even the door from your garage to your home. Report any suspicious activity or individuals to the Police immediately at 847-438-9050.
- Keep your cash box in a safe place. Fanny packs work well as portable cash boxes.
- The Police department has requested that parking be on the odd numbered side of the street to keep room for emergency vehicles. Please advise customers of this policy
- For the safety of everyone involved, please contain your pets.



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Garage Sale Tips

- Beware when you open your garage door! Garage sale enthusiasts have been known to camp out at the crack of dawn- especially if you have something listed that they are interested in.
- Have a cash box with \$40-\$50 in small bills for change when you open. It is usually a good idea to have only 1-2 people in charge of handling cash.
- Put your best items out in the driveway. This will draw customers to your sale.
- Price realistically. Price items at 10%-20% of the retail price. If the items are new
 or unused and still in the original packaging you can go higher, but it should still be
 50% off retail price.
- Expect haggling. Don't be insulted if a customer wants to work out a deal for a reduced price or for a group item discount. Many shoppers love to do this and it is a big part of garage sale dealings.
- Put any items you do not wish to sell behind a line of demarcation or simply out of sight.
